



One of these symbols of prosperity, as it were, is the number of massive trees flanking the roads, providing much needed shade. Development of a new road, formation of a bypass, or widening of an existing road



results in rapid development on the stretch, right from the edge of the road. And, thus there is hardly any space to take up planting of saplings. What will happen now? When all the tree parts including roots die completely, people will forget the fallen tree.

During the last few decades, water, air and land have been contaminated for achieving short term gains at the cost of long term ecological losses to the environment. We need to help the environment because we live on earth, and this is the only place we can live on right now. If we treat it like the city dump it becomes dirty and unlivable. If we treat it well, the earth stays a clean place, perfect for living, for ourselves and our children. We use air for breathing, water for drinking and other daily chores. Even the food we eat is derived from plants and animals including vegetables, milk, eggs, etc. In consideration of these requirements, protection of these resources has become very important today.

Wanted: A second salt Satyagraha

Ahmedabad: A second salt satyagraha is the need of the hour in order to get rid table salt of all harmful substances, said Shiv Shankar Gupta, who has recently took premium Indian salt brands to task over the use of potassium ferrocyanide in salt as anti-caking agent.

Universal iodization is part of a larger marketing gimmick and conspiracy to sell refined salt as "iodized salt", and it has successfully killed the sale of natural salt, which is abundantly available in our country, said Gupta, a 91-year old man, who has seen the transition of multi-core Indian salt industry. In addition to this they are adding toxic drug compounds like potassium ferrocyanide as anti caking agents, which is already being prohibited by countries like United States and Great Britain due to the toxic substance in it, he alleged. Shortfall in Procurement of Foodgrains

New Delhi: Department of Food & Public Distribution deals with procurement of wheat, paddy and coarsegrains at the Minimum Support Price (MSP). However, if any producer/farmer gets better price in comparison to MSP, he is free to sell his produce in open market.

Government fixes MSPs for 22 mandated agricultural crops and fair & remunerative price (FRP) for sugarcane on the basis of the recommendations of the Commission for Agricultural Costs and Prices (CACP), after considering the views of State Governments and Central Ministries/Departments concerned and other relevant factors.

As informed by the Department of Agriculture Cooperation & Farmers Welfare, the Union Budget for 2018-19 had announced the pre-determined principle to keep MSP at a level of at least one and half times of the cost of production. Accordingly, Government had increased MSPs for all mandated crops with a return of at least 50 percent over all India weighted average cost of production for the season 2018-19. Government has recently increased the MSPs for all Kharif crops for 2019-20 season in line with the principle of providing at least 50 percent return over all India weighted average cost of production.

This information was given in a written reply by the Minister of State for Consumer Affairs, Food & Public Distribution, Shri Dhanu Rao Saheb Dadarao in the Lok Sabha.
